PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants should possess a second class honours (2,2 minimum) primary degree (Level 8, NMQ) in a relevant or cognate discipline that incorporates a substantial educational component.
- It is expected that applicants should have a minimum of two years' experience as a teacher or as a worker in an educational setting. The applied nature of the programme usually requires participants to be working in an educational or similar people-focused setting.
- Entry criteria into the Graduate Diploma or the Masters in Education (Middle Leadership and Mentoring) is contingent on achieving a second class honours (2,2 minimum) in the Certificate in Middle Leadership and Mentoring. The Masters programme can be taken in one calendar year.
- Please note the course may fill up quickly so early applications are advised.
