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Founded in 1898 by the Catholic **Bishop of Limerick Edward** O'Dwyer and the Sisters of Mercy, Mary Immaculate College (MIC) is the largest Catholic higher education institution in Ireland. The Department of Theology and Religious Studies was established in 1999. It has seven full-time academic staff working on both MIC campuses (Limerick and Thurles) as well as the main University of Limerick campus, all with international teaching and research expertise. They are supported by several part-time academic staff with specialisms in all the major areas of theological scholarship.



WHY STUDY THEOLOGY & RELIGIOUS STUDIES?

The study of theology and religion aims to reflect critically on life's biggest questions. It explores questions about God, about the world around us, and about ourselves. In studying theology and religion we reflect on our beliefs and question whether they are reasonable. This is a challenging and rewarding process, and can even be a transformative and lifechanging experience.

No previous study of theology and religion, nor any particular denominational affiliation, is required to study Theology & Religious Studies as a subject. If you have a real interest in exploring life's deepest questions, and if you want to help other students to do so too, then this subject is for you!

UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES

Theology and Religious Studies is offered on several of MIC's undergraduate degree programmes (MI002, MI010 and MI011) in Limerick and Thurles. Modules cover all the sub-disciplines of the subject: philosophy of religion, historical theology, Christian ethics, pastoral theology, sacramental theology, ecclesiology and so on. The programme is designed to ensure that all the requirements of the Teaching Council for the teaching of religion are met. Those taking primary teaching degrees can specialise in Theology & Religious Education.

POST-PRIMARY TEACHING QUALIFICATION

Staff from the Department of Theology and Religious Studies teach on the post-primary concurrent teacher education degrees (MI010 and MI011) on our MIC, St Patrick's Campus, Thurles. These programmes are accredited by the Teaching Council and graduates are qualified to teach Religious Studies to honours Leaving Certificate level after the completion of their four year degree programme.
